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# **COURSE OUTCOMES**

#### SEMESTER I

#### PAPER I – (1T1) POETRY FROM CHAUCER TO MILTON

- **CO-1.** Students will be able to understand the major changes that took place in English literature as it transitioned from a traditional to a modern form.
- **CO-2.** Students will be able to identify and analyze the different forms of poetry, such as sonnets, free verse, etc.
- **CO-3.** Students will be able to understand the social, economic, and political factors that contributed to the upheavals and disturbances that were prevalent in working class communities.

#### PAPER 2- (1T2) RENAISSANCE DRAMA

- **CO-1.** Students will come to know about the beginning of English drama and what role did the initial contributors play to give this well-developed English theatre.
- **CO-2.** Students will acquire knowledge about the different Genres of drama during the era.
- **CO-3.** Students will be able to critically examine the form of drama adopted by the predecessors who provided a solid foundation to great Shakespearean dramas and the dramatists who followed in the Jacobean period.
- **CO-4.** Students will try to investigate the reasons for the decline of drama in the Jacobean age and examine the contributions of the writers and their works.

## PAPER 3- (1T3-A) INDIAN WRITING IN ENGLISH I

- **CO-1.** Students will find that Romanticism of Indian poets was fraught with nationalism, spirituality and mysticism and so was different from English romanticism.
- **CO-2**. Students will learn the contribution of pre-independence Indian English writers who would plumb the depth of humble life and reveal dignity or majesty of middle class and underprivileged characters through their novels reflecting the social problems.
- **CO-3**. Students will be able to Analyze and interpret the novel "Two Leaves and a Bud" by Mulk Raj Anand.
- **CO-4.** Students will try to analyze and interpret the historical events and social issues in British India in reference with the detailed text.

#### PAPER 4-(1T4-A) THE ENGLISH NOVEL –I

- **CO-1.** Students will be able to differentiate in the different forms of novels and know how novel is different from other forms of writing.
- **CO-2.** Students will learn about different narrative techniques applied to novels to suit immense variety of social setting, of incidents and or characters.
- **CO-3.** Students will learn how a historical novel reconstructs the life of the past.
- **CO-4.** Students will analyze and interpret the novel "Ivanhoe" by Walter Scott, examining its historical context, themes of chivalry, and the depiction of medieval society in reference with background

### SEMESTER II

# PAPER I- (2T1) RESTORATION AND EIGHTEEN CENTURY ENGLISH LITERATURE

- CO-1. Students will learn about the politics that brought turmoil in the Seventeen century England
- CO-2. Students will learn how Pope's use of the mock-epic form is intricate and exhaustive
- CO-3. Students will be able to compare and contrast Restoration, Neo-classical and Romantic revival literature
- CO-4 Students will be able to know about the poets of the eighteen century and their writing styles.

# PAPER II- (2T2) MODERN ENGLISH DRAMA

- **CO-1.** Students will learn about moral and social order in contemporary life through bold criticism in problem plays
- **CO-2.** Students will learn about dramatists who vociferously protested prevalent social institutions.
- **CO-3.** Students will come to know about dramatists who were shaping force of Poetic drama in the literature of twentieth century
- **CO-4.** Students will understand how the theatre of absurd envisaged a radical departure from all kinds of unconventional drama.

# PAPER III- (2T3-A) INDIAN WRITING IN ENGLISH –II

- **CO-1**.Student will be able to interpret how the modern or experimental Indian English poetry is part of the process of modernization in which an independent culture emerges
- **CO-2.** Students will understand how the post-Independence shift in the attitude towards women has led to their improved status in society.
- **CO-3.** Student will come across the postcolonial world plagued by neocolonial catastrophe like economic disorder, social malaise, governmental corruption and state repression as shown in the fiction of modern Indian novelist's repression as shown in **CO-4.** Students will find that the Contemporary Indian drama, deviating from classical and European models, is experimental and innovative in terms of thematic and technical qualities.

#### PAPER IV- (2T4-A) THE ENGLISH NOVEL =II

- **CO-1**. Students will understand difference in the themes and techniques of Victorian and Modern Novels from earlier novels
- **CO-2.** Students will get acquaint with the positive change in the status of women as compared to the earlier times, as reflected in the themes of the novels that women have written
- **CO-3.** Students attempts to know the social problems of England during the Victorian and Modern age that found passionate exponent in the novel of those times
- **CO-4** students will trace the defects of society to the defects of human nature.

#### SEMESTER III

# PAPER I- (3T1) Romantic and Victorian poetry
